- 1. What happened in our last Bible Study?
 - a. God told Saul (through Samuel) that he delights in obedience rather than sacrifice.
 - b. God tells Saul the rebellion and arrogance is like divination and idolatry...not a lesser sin, but one of the worst we can think of.
 - c. Saul begs Samuel (representing the presence and hand of God) to go back with him so that the people can see that God is still with him.
 - d. Samuel refuses to go back with Saul because God had rejected Saul's kingship and would not change his mind (but he went back for one worship service).
 - e. Samuel put Agag, king of the Amalekites, to death.
 - f. Samuel left Saul and did not see Saul again for his whole life...and Samuel mourned for him.

 - a. God speaks to Samuel.
 - b. God instructs Samuel that it is time to move on and stopping mourning for Saul.
 - c. God tells Samuel to fill his horn with oil and go to Jesse of Bethlehem.
 - d. God tells Samuel that he has chosen one of Jesse's sons to be king.

 - a. Yes, Lord, anything you say. To obey is better than sacrifice.
 - b. How can I go? If Saul hears about it, he will kill me.
