**1 Timothy 1:8-11**

1. What does this text say about the law?
  - a. It is bad, that is why Jesus did away with it (see also Matt 5:17-19)
  - b. It is good, if one uses it properly.
  - c. It is for the righteous.
  - d. It is for lawbreakers and rebels, etc.
  
2. What does it mean to use the law properly?
  - a. To use it as a weapon against people that have made a decision to follow Christ.
  - b. To use it as a checklist of righteousness so we can feel good about each evil thing we remove from our lives.
  - c. To help us realize how far we have strayed from God's plan when we might otherwise have believed that we were ok because our lives were similar to some of the best people we know and we aren't as bad as many people around us.
  - d. To use it as a guide when we are far from God to show us back to Him.
  
3. Why is the law not made for the righteous?
  - a. Because the righteous don't have to follow the law anymore because they are under grace.
  - b. Because the law is written on their hearts, so the law is fulfilled in them (see Jeremiah 31:33, Hebrews 8:10 & 10:16).
