c. Well, actually, most of this story takes place after the festival was over.

a. Apparently, Jesus' family left with out him.
b. Jesus' family thought he was with them, so they must have been traveling in a large group of family and friends.
c. When his family couldn't find them, they went back to Jerusalem to look for him.
d. Even when his family returned to Jerusalem, it took them 3 days to find him.
Where was Jesus when they found him?
What was he doing?
What does verse 47 tell us about the people who were listening to him?
Why do you think they were so amazed (see also Matthew 7:29)?
a. Well, he was 12.
b. The religious leaders had been through extensive training in the scriptures. It is not clear if his
answers were amazing because they exceeded the teachers or simply because they displayed
remarkable wisdom for his age, but either way, it was clear that Jesus was different from other
12-year-olds.
How did his parents respond when they found him?
a. They were astonished.
b. They said, "why have you treated us like this?"
How did Jesus respond, according to verse 49?
Have you ever lost track of your kids for a little while?
Have you ever had kids that lose track of time and get left?
How about for 3 days?

What does verse 51 tell us about Jesus and his relationship to his parents?
