- 1. What is Paul saying in 11:16-21?
  - a. He is not a fool.
  - b. If he was a fool, they would put up with his antics better...so maybe just put up with me like you would a fool.
  - c. It is foolish to boast in your own abilities as the world does...but why does the boasting that Paul does in Christ bother the church more than the boasting of arrogant fools who boast in themselves?
  - d. He seems to sarcastically suggest that the they consider themselves smarter or wiser than everyone else...including him, which is why they question him so much.
  - e. He points out that they have put up with the arrogant who take advantage of them and suggests that Paul and his companions were not "strong enough" or "confident enough" in themselves to do that to the church.
- 2. What does Paul say about himself in verses 11:21b-29?
  - a. He is a Hebrew and an Israelite, if that is something to be proud of.
  - b. He is a servant of Christ.
  - c. He has worked harder, been in prison more frequently, been flogged more severely, and been exposed to death more, etc...if asceticism and suffering is what we are proud of.

6.	<ul> <li>What are we to make of all of Paul's boasts in this text?</li> <li>a. He is one arrogant dude.</li> <li>b. He is really frustrated that the church is so easily influenced by supposed leaders who seem all about bragging about their qualifications.</li> <li>c. He is pointing out how useless it is to brag about all of these thingsand at the same time noting how different this is than anything he has ever wrote about. It was not his pattern to boast about these sorts of things.</li> </ul>
