  - a. This is the day that the Lord has made, I will rejoice and be glad in it (Psalm 118:24)
  - b. This is the term that has been used since the Old Testament to refer to the end or the day of Judgment (See Amos 5:18-20 and Joel 2:31, cited in Acts 2:20).
  - c. In the New Testament, this phrase is connected also with the return of Christ or the second coming (See also 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11, Matthew 24:34-35, Mark 28:30-31)
- 2. How will the day of the Lord come, according to Peter in verse 10 (see also Matt 24:36-25:13, Mark 13:32-37, 1 Thessalonians 5:1-3, Revelation 16:15)?\_\_\_\_\_

- 9. What does Peter remind people in 3:15-16?
  - a. Paul has written about these same things.
  - b. Paul is consistent in all of his letters.

- 10. What affect does Peter hope this warning will have on the people of God, according to 3:17-18?
  - a. That we will be on our guard.
  - b. That we will not be carried away by the error of the 'lawless.'
  - c. That we will not fall from our secure position.
  - d. That we will grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
