- 1. What happened in our last Bible Study in 2 Samuel 11?
 - a. It was spring, when kings go off to war.
 - b. David was home in bed.
 - c. David took a walk and saw a beautiful woman bathing.
 - d. David asked about her and found out she was the wife of Uriah the Hittite.
 - e. David sent for her and slept with her and she became pregnant.
 - f. David sent for Uriah to create an excuse for him to go home so that maybe he wouldn't get caught when the wife of a soldier who had been away turns up pregnant.
 - g. Uriah didn't go home, but slept on his mat at the gate and David tried to get him drunk so that hopefully he would go home.
 - h. Finally, David sent word to Joab to put Uriah on the front line where he might easily be killed and then withdraw from him to make sure he is killed.
- 2. What happens in 12:1-4?
 - a. The Lord sent Nathan to David.
 - b. Nathan told David a story.
 - c. In Nathan's story. There were two men (one rich and the other poor) and the rich man with many cattle. The poor man had nothing except one ewe lamb that was like part of the family. A traveler came to the rich man but, rather than taking one of his many sheep or cattle, he took the ewe lamb from the poor man to prepare a meal.
