- 1. What happened in our text last week in 2 Samuel 13?
  - a. Do we really have to talk about that again?
  - b. Well, it ended with Absalom killing Amnon and going into exile.
  - c. It really ended with David being consoled regarding Amnon and now longing for his son Absalom.
- 2. What happens now in 14:1-3?
  - a. Joab knew that the king's heart longed of Absalom.
  - b. Joab sent for a wise woman from Tekoa.
  - c. Joab told the "wise woman" to pretend she is mourning...and go talk to the king.
  - d. I think Joab is planning a ruse.
- 3. What did the woman say to David when she went to see him, according to 14:5-11?
  - a. I am a widow; my husband is dead.
  - b. I had two sons who got in a fight and one killed the other.
  - c. Everyone in my family wants to kill my son who is left because of what he did to his brother.
  - d. She said they wanted to kill her husband's only heir.
  - e. She made David swear by the Lord that her son and her family would be pardoned.
- 4. What did the woman say next, according to 14:12-17?
  - a. She asked to be free to speak a word to the king.

  - c. He agreed and sent Joab to bring Absalom back to Israel.
- 8. What did Joab do when he heard this from the king, according to 14:22-23?
  - a. He fell with his face to the ground to honor the king.
  - b. He thanked the king for agreeing to his request.
  - c. He did as the king said and went to get Absalom.
- 9. What should we learn from all of this?
  - a. What Joab did can't have been right.
  - b. Perhaps, sometimes these types of methods are required for people to see the truth of God...this isn't much different from how Nathan talked to David, is it?
  - c. I think that throughout this mess, we do at least hear a truth about God.
