
A.L.I.V.E. Bible Study Wednesday, September 9, 2020 Ezra 4:6-23

Suggested Additional Study Reading: The book of Esther

- 1. What happened in Sunday's study in Ezra 6:13-23?
 - a. The Israelites continued to build the temple.
 - b. The Israelites prospered under the preaching of Haggai and Zechariah.
 - c. They celebrated the finishing of the temple.
 - d. The Israelites celebrated the Passover, remembering God's faithfulness and deliverance.
- 2. Was this the end of all opposition, according to Ezra 4:6? Yes No Explain.
- 3. When did all of this opposition happen?
