## A.L.I.V.E. Bible Study Wednesday, October 14, 2020 Nehemiah 7:73b-8:18

- 1. What happened in Sunday's Bible Study in Nehemiah 6:16-7:73?
  - a. The wall was finished.
  - b. The neighboring people had heard of the power of God (and saw this as a testimony that God was again with Israel) and therefore was afraid of what might happen.
  - c. The walls were finished, but Israel was empty, and the houses were not yet rebuilt.
  - d. Nehemiah took account of the Jews who had returned and gave people specific responsibilities for temple worship and the protection of Jerusalem.
  - e. Nehemiah saw that the job was not done when the last stone was laid in the wall. God had a bigger plan for the people.
- 2. What happens in 7:73b-8:3 in today's text?
  - a. It was the 7<sup>th</sup> month, so...
  - b. It was time for the major feasts of Israel's calendar, just like in Ezra 3.
  - c. The people came together and told Ezra to bring out the book of the Law of Moses.
  - d. Ezra read the law to all of the people from daybreak till noon...and all the people listened attentively!
- 3. So...do you think our people would be this excited about bringing out the commands of God to be read?
  - a. Man, I think our pastor preaches long enough as it is!
  - b. No, let's stick to the grace stuff and the lovey-dovey stuff.
  - c. Yes, of course! We want to know the will of God for our lives and need to hear about it and would stay for as long as it takes!
- 4. How, exactly, was the law read, according to 8:4-6?
  - a. Ezra stood up on a high wooden platform where all could see (and hear) him.
  - b. Ezra opened the book, and everyone stood up.
  - c. Ezra praised God and everyone lifted their hands and responded "Amen! Amen!"
  - d. Everyone bowed down and worshiped the Lord with their faces to the ground.
- 5. What were the Levites doing as the book of the Law was being read, according to 9:7-8?\_
- 6. Do we still do this sort of thing today? Yes\_\_\_\_ No\_\_\_\_ Explain. \_\_\_\_\_
- 7. What is going on in 8:13-17 (See also Leviticus 23, particularly verses 23-44)?
  - a. They are celebrating the last of the festivals, the festival of Tabernacles.
  - b. It seems like they didn't know anything about this festival until they had heard about it from the law.
  - c. Well, verse 17 says that they had not celebrated this festival like this since the days of Joshua when they first entered the promised land...so this is quite a revival and return to the commands of God!
- 8. What will our return/revival look like? Will there be things that God calls us to do that we have neglected for a long time or perhaps never done?
