- 1. What happened in Wednesday's Bible Study in Nehemiah 12?

- 3. Oh boy, here we go again. Why couldn't the Ammonites and Moabites be admitted to the assembly of God, according to 13:1-3 (See also Deuteronomy 23:3-6, Numbers 22-25 and Revelation 2:14)?
 - a. Man, it just seems like God picks his favorites. Some people he likes and other people are just out! Who can follow a God like this?
 - b. Well, there is very clear reasons for this command in Deuteronomy. It has to do with how they have treated Israel and what they are likely to do. For generations they have opposed Israel...and often in a way that is subversive and dishonest. They infiltrate and then lead Israel astray. It is safer to have a known enemy than someone who says they're your friend and comes into your assembly only to cause your downfall.
- 4. Surely, these people had changed and were worthy of another chance! How long had it been since all of that happened? Why was all of this important, according to 13:4-9 (See also Nehemiah 4:3)?
 - a. Well, apparently Tobiah was an Ammonite.
 - b. Tobiah seemed to be using the same sort of tactics we talked about...subversive...making friends who give him access and betraying Israel. It is described by his special privileges in the temple and it was described in chapter 6.
