Fulfilled – "He was despised and rejected by mankind, a man of suffering, and familiar with pain...." Acts 8:26-36, Isaiah 53

- d. Stephen has just been stoned (while people laid their cloaks at the foot of a man named Saul) and a great persecution has begun. Everyone but the apostles were scattered (diaspora).
