1.	Read Luke 2:8-11.	What do we learn	in this text about Jesus?

- a. He was announced by angels to the shepherds out in the fields.
- b. His coming was good news that would cause great joy.

	c. He was born in the town of David, he is the Messiah (Christ), and he is the Lord.		
2.	Read Matthew 4:12-17. This is the beginning of Jesus's earthly ministry. What do we lead about John the Baptist in verse 12?		
3.	<ul><li>What does Jesus do, according to verses 13-17?</li><li>a. He went to live in Capernaum.</li><li>b. He fulfilled what was said through the prophet Isaiah.</li><li>c. He began to preach</li></ul>		
1.	Read Isaiah 9:1-7. While the Luke text is in no way a quote of the Isaiah text, we associate this "announcement" of a child being born with the Luke 2 text. According to verse 1, what was the situation of the people to whom this great light appears?		

- 5. What would God do for them, according to verses 2-5?
  - a. The light of dawn will wipe away the darkness in which they have been living.
  - b. Their nation would be enlarged, their joy increased, and they will rejoice.
  - c. The burdensome yokes and the rods of their oppressors will be shattered.
  - d. The battle clothes and reminders of death and defeat will be burned.

- 7. What does Isaiah tell us about the "child" and "son" who will come to bring hope to these people?

  - e. He will be called Prince of Peace (See also Luke 1:32-33, 79, John 14:27, Ephesians 2:14-18).
  - f. There will be no end to the greatness of his government and peace.
  - g. He will reign on David's throne (Luke 1:32-33).
  - h. He will establish and uphold his kingdom with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever.
