Why, according to verse 13, did Jesus go up to Jerusalem? 1. a. Vacation. b. It was almost time for the Jewish Passover (remember our study earlier in this fulfilled series?) 2. What did Jesus find when he went to Jerusalem? a. People worshiping God. b. People selling cattle, sheep and doves. c. People sitting at tables exchanging money. 3. Why were they selling animals and changing money in the temple courts? a. People who traveled a long way to make their sacrifice might buy their sacrifice when they arrived in Jerusalem rather than bringing their own animal on the long journey. b. Money paid to the temple had to be paid in a certain kind of coin, so people would change the money used in their home country or area into this common coin. c. To take advantage of all the people coming to town to worship. 4. What, according to verses 15-16, did Jesus do when he found this situation? a. He made a whip out of cords and drove all from the temple courts. b. H scattered the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. c. He told those who sold doves to get out and stop turning his Father's house into a market. 5. What problem did Jesus have with this action? a. According to Matthew 21:13, they had made the temple (which should be a house of prayer) a 'den of robbers' b. In Matthew, Jesus quotes a text in Jeremiah (7:9-11) when God is upset with His people for living ungodly lives and then coming to the temple to worship as if they were godly people. The temple courts that were being used for this "market" was likely the court of the Gentiles. Non-Jews could not go beyond this court, so they did not have a place to pray and worship. d. Ultimately, people were making it more difficult for people to come close to God. What did Jesus' disciples remember when he did this? 6. Does zeal for God's house consume you? Yes\_\_\_\_\_ No\_\_\_\_ What should this look like in the lives of believers today? a. We should keep people from selling things in the "church" building. b. We should make sure that no one comes in the way of people coming to God. c. We should never neglect the opportunity to worship God together with his people. 7. What question did the Jews ask Jesus when he confronted them? a. Who died and made you God? b. Why do we have to do what you say? c. What sign can you show us to prove your authority? 8. What sign did Jesus offer? a. He produced a miracle upon command. b.
