## A.L.I.V.E. Bible Study Date: March 10, 2021 Fulfilled – John 9:13-41

- 1. What happened in Sunday's Bible Study in John 9:1-12?
- 2. To whom, according to verse 13, did people bring the man who had been born blind?
  - a. Jesus, of course. Isn't that always who people brought people to.
  - b. The Pharisees. The man didn't need healing any more, they brought him as a witness against Jesus.

Who is the "they" that brough him to the Pharisees (you may need to look back into the previous text)?

What problem, according to verses 14-16, did they find with this healing?\_\_\_\_\_

- 3. What conclusions did they draw from this, according to verses 16-19?
  - a. Jesus is surely sent from God and God must be ok with healing on the Sabbath.
  - b. They declared that Jesus was not of God.
  - c. They pointed out Jesus' failure to observe the law and essentially called him a sinner.
  - d. Some asked "How could a sinner perform such signs?"
  - e. They called for the man's parents to prove that the miracle had really happened.
- 4. How did the man and his parents answer the inquiries of the Pharisees, according to verses 17-23 (See also Mark 8:27-30)?
  - a. The man said Jesus was a prophet.
  - b. His parents told the Pharisees to ask their son. He isn't a child anymore!
  - c. His parents refused to answer because they were afraid of the Jewish leaders.
  - d. His parents refused to answer because they did not want to be put out of the synagogue for saying that Jesus was the Messiah.
- 5. What happened when the man was called back in to answer the question again (verses 24- 34)?
  - a. He first refused to pass judgment and only offered the evidence: "I was blind but now I see!"
  - b. He got frustrated that they kept questioning him.
  - c. He was confused about why they were so interested in this fellow (perhaps they wanted to become his disciples too).
  - d. He found it strange that they didn't think Jesus was from God since "God does not listen to sinners. He listens to the godly person who does his will."
  - e. They declared the man a sinner from birth and unworthy of teaching them.
- 6. Did the man believe that Jesus was the Messiah, according to verses 35-38?
  - a. He didn't claim Jesus as the Messiah.
  - b. He didn't even know who the "Son of Man" was.
  - c. If that is who Jesus claims to be, he will believe whatever Jesus says because he was blind and now he sees.
- 7. What does Jesus say about blindness, according to 39-41?
  - a. He came that the blind would see and those who see would become blind.
  - b. He meant that he has compassion on those who are "like sheep without a shepherd" but corrects those "blind guides" who claim to know better.
  - c. He begins to talk about spiritual things rather than physical (again), using the metaphor of sight.
