- 1. What did we learn last week at the beginning of Exodus 1, which sets up the entire Exodus story?
  - a. We learn the names of the sons of Israel who went to Egypt.
  - b. Joseph and his generation died.
  - c. The Israelites were exceedingly fruitful, multiplied greatly, and increased in numbers.
  - d. A new king, to whom Joseph meant nothing, came to power in Egypt.
  - e. The new king was concerned that these numerous Israelites would fight against Egypt if war broke out.
- 2. What, according to 1:11-14, did the Egyptian king do to try to keep Israel under control?
- 3. What does verse 12 tell us about the effectiveness of this plan?\_\_\_\_\_
- 4. What did the Egyptian king try next, according to verses 15-16?\_\_\_\_\_
- 5. How did the midwives respond, according to verse 17?
- 6. What happened when the king of Egypt found out about the continued multiplication of Israel, according to verses 18-21?

- a. He asked them "Why have you done this?"
- b. The midwives told Pharoah that Hebrew women are different from Egyptian women. They are vigorous and give birth before the midwives arrive.
- c. God protected the midwives because they feared Him and he gave them families of their own.
- 7. What did Pharoah do next, according to 1:22?
- 8. What happened in 2:1-10?
  - a. A Levite (of the tribe that would later become the priests) couple gave birth to a son.
  - b. She hid her son for 3 months and when she could hide him no longer, she floated him in a basket with tar and pitch (to waterproof it) and hid him in the reeds along the bank of the Nile.
  - c. His sister stood at a distance to see what would happen.
  - d. Pharoah's daughter went down to the Nile to bathe and saw the basket among the reeds.
  - e. His sister asked Pharoah's daughter if she could go get a Hebrew woman to nurse the baby for her.
  - f. She went and got the baby's mother and Pharoah's daughter had the child's own mother nursed him until he grew older and became the son of the Pharoah's daughter.
  - g. She named him Moses.
