- 1. What did we talk about in the last week's study?
 - a. More details and ritual.

 - a. Well, it looks like we have more instructions for ceremonies and rituals.
 - b. In chapter 30, we have the altar of incense, the atonement money, the basin for washing, the anointing oil, and the incense.
 - c. In chapter 31, we have Bezlel and Oholiab, whoever they were, and The Sabbath.
- 3. What do 30:11-16 say about the "Atonement money"?
 - a. God told Moses to take a Census of the Israelites.
 - b. Each person who was counted (20 years old or older) was to give a half a shekel.
 - c. The rich and the poor were to give the same, so this is different than the tithe.
 - d. We are told that this atonement offering was to be paid in order to make atonement for their lives.
 - e. The offering was to be used for the service of the tent of meeting.
- 4. I'm sure a lot of us bristle at the thought of this (or sometimes any) offering. Why would they do something like this and why is this different from the tithe?
 - a. The tithe is based on income and is given in order to give thanks for God's provision of food and to show trust in God for his future provision.
 - b. This is a reminder that God has given us life and is a flat offering. Everyone's life is worth the same, no matter how rich or poor they are.
 - c. God used this to provide
 - d. Nobody knows for sure how much this offering is. A shekel is a weight and it doesn't specifically say a shekel of what. Commentators believe that it was a weight of silver. In today's money, this would be somewhere between \$2-\$6, so it wasn't a major tax.
