4.	<ul> <li>Wait, did God really just say he was going to work against the purpose that he was supposedly sending Moses to Egypt for?</li> <li>a. Did I read this wrong?</li> <li>b. I'm sure that's not what he meant.</li> <li>c. Maybe this was a misprint.</li> <li>d. Yes! God is working a bigger plan. He is not JUST delivering Israel from Egypt, but he is also showing His people the extent of his power and his ability so that they will trust him in difficult circumstances in the future.
