## A.L.I.V.E. Bible Study Date: July 10, 2022 Exodus 7:14-24

- 1. What happened in last week's Bible Study?
  - a. There was a genealogy that set the place of Moses and Aaron within in the tribes of Israel and within the tribe of Levite for those who would read and look back.
  - b. Moses and Aaron met with Pharoah and performed the first miracle, the staff turning into a snake.
  - c. Pharoah's heart was hardened, and he didn't respond to their request or to the miracle.
  - d. We noted that this part of the story is more narrative and descriptive and less personal than the first section, which described the call of Moses and his discussions with God, had been.
- 2. What is happening now in 7:14-15?

  - b.   - a. God sent me to tell you to let my people go, but so far you haven't listened.
  - b. God is going to show you that He has authority over you (that He is the Lord).
  - c. I am going to strike the Nile with my staff and it will be changed into blood.
  - d. The fish of the Nile will die, the river will stink, and the Egyptians will not have anything to drink.
  - e. Wait is this the same second sign that we learned about before? Because it sounds a little different.
