- 1. What does God say about Israel in 11:12-12:1?
 - A. Uhh...aren't we done yet? Bad things. Over and over again.
 - B. Ephraim feeds on wind Flatters himself with vain, delusive hopes, of receiving effectual support from the alliances which he forms. It is a proverbial expression to signify labor in vain, or pursuing such measures as will bring damage rather than benefit.
- 2. What does God say about Israel & Judah in 12:2-5?
 - A. He speaks about Jacob's birth. Jacob's was called Israel, but his birth name Jacob meant "grabber" or "usurper." He and his brother were twins, but he was intent and making himself first from the womb (Genesis 25:26)...and stole his brother's birthright (Genesis 27).
 - B. He reminds Israel of Jacob's struggle with the angel and his perseverance, after which he was called Israel or "one who prevails with God."
 - C. He reminds Israel of Jacob seeing God at Bethel (Genesis 28)

3.	Jacob's story was unique in a time where few had truly known God. He had been a prophesy about him from birth that was not very flattering, but God spoke new life into him with a new name. This should not be a unique story any more, because this is what God has promised all of us through the Gospel. But Israel the man because Israel the nation and forgot God. Does this ever happen to us? Individually? As a nation? Give examples. Share stories.
