- 1. Who, according to 1:1 wrote the book of Joel?
- 2. When was the book of Joel written?
 - A. Probably after Hosea and before Amos...
 - B. We really don't know. There isn't much in there that allows us to date it...no lists of kings like Hose or Amos, etc.
 - C. It is probably placed in this position because of links between the content of Joel chapter 3 and Amos chapter 1 more than because of it's timing.
- 3. How is the book of Joel structured?
 - A. Probably randomly. As little as I know about scripture, it all seems random to me.
 - B. There are two major sections. After the title in 1:1, 1:2-2:17 contain "words of exhortation" and 2:18-3:2 contain "words of assurance" that God will respond if we return to him.
- 4. What was happening at the time of the writing of the book of Joel, according 1:4?
- 5. What does Joel say to Israel in 1:2?
 - A. Listen up!
 - B. Has anything like this ever happened? Shouldn't this catch your attention.
 - C. Your children don't have historical context, but you do. Let them know how big a deal this is!
- 6. What, according to 1:5, was the situation in Israel at the time of this plague of locusts?
 - A. Apparently, they were all drunk.
 - B. Everybody was so focused on their own enjoyment or maybe self-medicating, etc., that nobody seemed to be paying attention to the signs of the times and asking the question "what might this mean for us?"
 - C. If you can't pay attention to anything else, at least pay attention to the fact that you won't have any more wine because the harvest is gone!
