- 1. Who, spoke to Israel, according to 1:1?
  - a. Malachi
  - b. This is the word of the Lord.
- 2. When was the book of Malachi written?
  - a. There is no clear reference within the book that can be used to date it.
  - b. After the reconstruction of the temple, which happened in about 515.
  - c. Not long after the time of Ezra and Nehemiah, since Malachi deals with the same sins that they do.
  - d. After Haggai & Zechariah, making it the last of the Old Testament writings.
- 3. What is the first message from the Lord to Israel, according to 1:2?

4. How to God's people respond to this, according to 1:2? \_\_\_\_\_ Do you have trouble believing that God loves you? Yes\_\_\_\_ No\_\_\_\_\_

- 5. How does God respond to this question, according to 1:3-5?
  - a. He reminds Israel of the times when he gave them undeserved favor.
  - b. He shows them their life and history from another perspective.
- 6. Why was Israel suffering during this time, if they were "loved" or "chosen", according to 1:6?
  - a. They didn't know! Things were supposed to get better when they returned and rebuilt the temple.
  - b. They had been disobedient and were suffering the consequences of their sin. Being obedient in one area doesn't make God ignore other areas of disobedience (James 2:10)
  - c. Sometimes, we suffer because we are doing what is right (John 15:1-4, 1 Peter 1:6-9).
- 7. What does the Lord say through Malachi in 1:6a?
  - a. A son honors his father.
  - b. A slave honors his master.
  - c. If I am a father...or a master, where is the honor and respect due me?
  - d. It is even the priests who show contempt for my name.
