- 1. Who do we meet in verse 1?
  - a. The priest...
  - b. Pashhur son of Immer.
  - c. The official in charge of the temple of the Lord.
- 2. What did he do when he heard Jeremiah prophesying, according to verses 1-2?
  - a. Celebrated an honest prophet who spoke the word of the Lord.
  - b. He had Jeremiah beaten and put in the stocks at the Upper Gate of Benjamin at the Lord's temple.
- 3. What happened the next day, according to verses 3-6?
  - a. Pashur released Jeremiah from the stocks.
  - b. Jeremiah realized the error of his ways and changed what he was prophesying.
  - c. Jeremiah knew he was right, but decided that it was wise to keep quiet.
  - d. Jeremiah declared that Pashhur's name would be changed to "Terror on Every Side" (nice name).
  - e. Jeremiah declared that this man, who was supposed to represent God as priest, would be a terror to himself and his friends and he would see the result of his actions with his own eyes when he sees those whom he had led astray fall by the sword of their enemies, etc...but he and his family would go into exile in Babylon.
