## A.L.I.V.E. Bible Study Date: November 22, 2023 Joel 2:1-17

- 1. What does it say to do in the beginning of 2:1?
  - A. I guess we're in for a band concert.
  - B. Blow the trumpet in Zion.
  - C. Sound the alarm...as if there is a pending attack. Everyone should come in from the surrounding areas to the fortified city.
  - D. Although this was often a battle alarm, it is also used in many cases in scripture to sound a spiritual alarm and call people to the place of prayer and worship for the same reason and in the same way.
  - E. The prophet has been calling this "plague" of locusts and "army" and using the military symbolism all along.
- 2. What are the implications of verse 11?
  - A. We should find hope because God is stronger...you know he who is for us is greater than he that is against us.
  - B. Uh oh...It sounds like God is at the heady of the army that is coming after us...so he who is against us is greater that he who is for us...that's not good.
  - C. The prophet is declaring this as a day of judgment...a day when God has judged against our actions and is not on our side.
- 3. After all that, what does God say in verse 12?
  - A. Even now...
  - B. Return to me with all your heart.
  - C. Show your sincerity with your actions, fasting, weeping, and mourning.
- 4. What is the significance of verse 13?
  - A. God says "rend" your heart and not your garments...but I don't know what that means.
  - B. It was common to tear your clothes in distress or times of mourning.
  - C. God is saying that the thing that we need to have a broken heart for our actions and don't just go through the motions of "mourning."
- 5. What does God say will happen if we return in this way, according to verses 13-14?
  - A. God is gracious and compassionate, he has to forgive us.
  - B. God's character is compassionate AND just. He doesn't have to forgive, but "who knows?" maybe he will if we are truly repentant.
- 6. What is the significance of verse 16?
  - A. God says everyone should gather.
  - B. God says for even the nursing children to come...and the bridegroom to leave his room and the bride her chamber.
  - C. Apparently, this is such a big deal that it should take precedence over even the most justifiable reasons. Certain things call for us to drop everything and make this a priority...and this call to repentance is one of them.
